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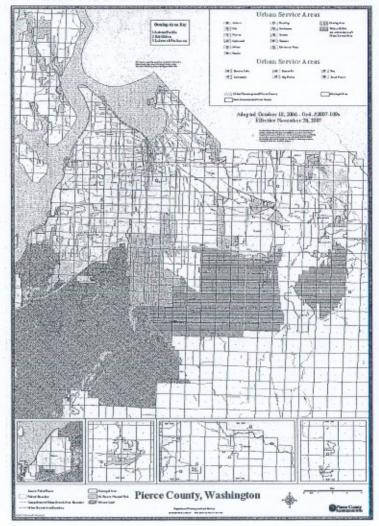

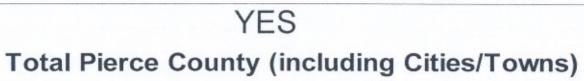

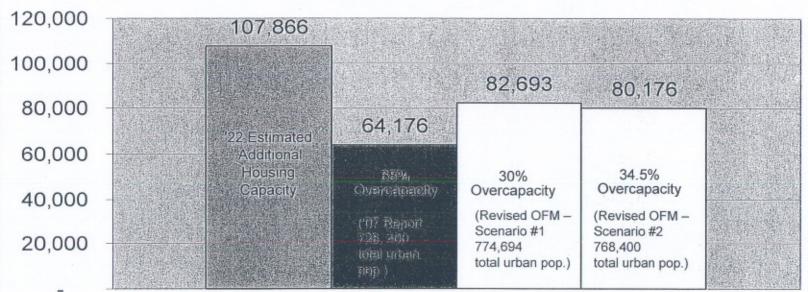
Estimating Housing Capacity of UGA

Is there enough Residential Land in Pierce County for expected Residential Growth?





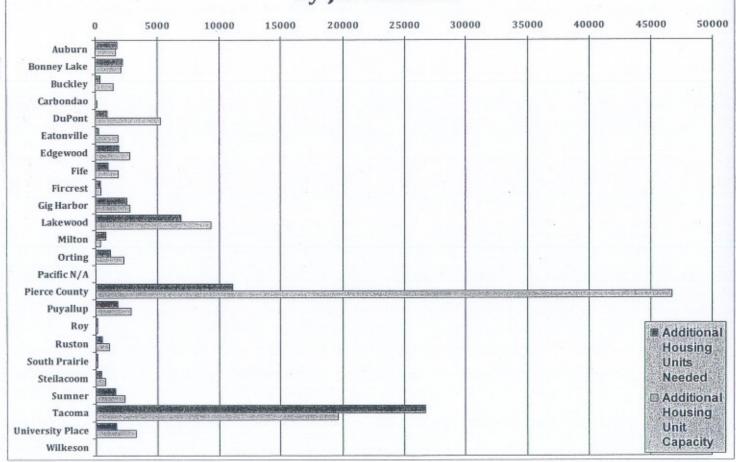

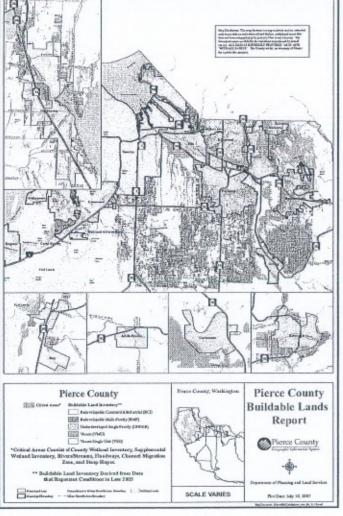
Housing Unit Need vs. Capacity by Jurisdiction

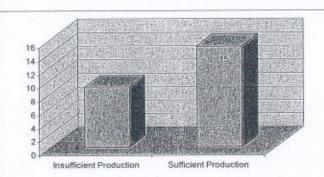
Density by # of Lots in Plat Pierce County - MSF Zone

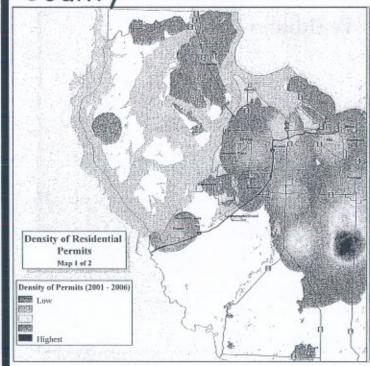




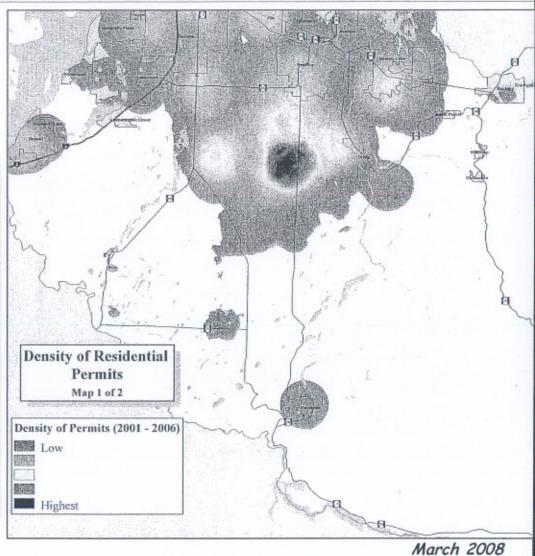
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Density of Residential Permit Activity Relative to Entire County
